- Major disruption to travel and power supplies




FIGURE 3 - For use with Question 1





FIGURE 7 - For use with Question 2





FIGURE 8 - For use with Question 2







FIGURE 13 – For use with Question 3




FIGURE 21 – For use with Question 5


